SAAM buys out Boskalis in tugging venture

Simpson Thacher & Bartlett LLP, Demarest Advogados and Basham, Ringe y Correa, SC have helped Chilean maritime logistics company SAAM acquire Dutch counterpart Boskalis' stake in a joint venture for US\$200 million.

Boskalis is believed to have turned to Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer LLP for the deal, but this could not be confirmed prior to publication.

The deal closed on 8 May.

SAAM will acquire 49% of the business in Mexico, Panama and Canada and 50% in Brazil through the deal.

Boskalis and SAAM entered their joint venture in 2014. The two companies shared towage activities in Brazil, Panama, Mexico and Canada.

The operation boasts a total fleet of 106 tugboats operating in 30 ports across four countries, including three of most important terminals in the Americas — Santos in Brazil, and Balboa and Colón in Panama.
